# **REFLECTION by Nick Brodie**

Munching insects and honey in the wilderness, John the Baptist was clearly a memorable figure. But as noteworthy as his camel shirt clearly appeared. John did not want attention for his own sake. John's core message, the Gospel of Mark tells us, is that we need to respond to the God who approaches us.

Pope Francis says something that echoes John's approach. In one of his apostolic exhortations he encourages us as follows: 'Your life ought to be a prophetic stimulus to others to leave a mark on this world.' What Pope Francis means is that we are all meant to be voices in the wildernesses of our time.

During Advent, therefore, we are all called to be welcoming voices singing a prophetic tune. As Pope Francis has often encouraged us, we should be good stewards for all creation. Christians should take the lead in caring for the earth and the poor who inhabit it. Similarly, the Pope has encouraged us to be a synodal people, learning to walk and talk together in harmony as the People of God. Christians should not cling to divisive nostalgias, but cherish what matters and face the future with openness and confidence.
